Market Month August 2021 – Video Transcript

Welcome to the August 2021 edition of Market Month.

August was a strong month for stocks, with a few of the benchmark indexes reaching record highs.

The Nasdaq led the way in August (4.0%), followed by the S&P 500 (2.9%), the Russell 2000 (2.1%), the Global Dow (2.1%), and the Dow (1.2%).

Year to date, stocks remain well ahead of their 2020 closing values. The S&P 500 leads the benchmark indexes (20.4%), followed by the Nasdaq (18.4%), the Global Dow (16.5%), the Dow (15.5%), and the Russell 2000 (15.1%).
